THE ECONOMICS OF THE SEX INDUSTRY IN SOUTHEAST ASIA

Wednesdays 7:00 – 9:00 pm.

This course examines the 'oldest' industry in the world from an economics perspective, within the Southeast Asian region. Specifically, the course will investigate the unique cultural and religious factors of this region and how these factors may influence the demand side and supply side of the market. Other topics covered in the course include the market structure, government regulation and the resulting policy implications. Special topics unique to the regions such as child prostitution, human trafficking for the purpose of prostitution, and sex tourism will also be discussed.

This highly-visual course will present maps and mapping in a multi-dimensional way. Its basic tenant is to engage students in "seeing" maps and charts throughout history, and, from all over the world, in new ways. That is analyzing what a map is or purports to be, what it projects to the viewer, and what history, culture, politics, the arts, and economics can tell us about it. In a word, a map is showing some state of the world as the mapmaker wants us to see it. Readings and maps will be given out during the course.
