

2008-2009 Verification Worksheet (2 Sided Form)

Federal Student Aid Programs

Your application was selected for review in a process called "Verification." In this process, your school will be comparing 2007 federal tax forms (and your spouse's if you are married, or parents if you are considered dependent for federal aid purposes). The law says we have the right to ask you for this information before awarding Federal aid. If there are differences between your application information and your financial documents, you may need to send in corrections on your Student Aid Report (SAR) and have a new SAR processed. Try to complete verification as soon as possible, so that your financial aid won't be delayed.

What should you do?

1. Collect your (and your parent's or spouse's financial documents- signed Federal Income Tax forms, W-2s, 1099s, etc.)
2. Talk to your financial aid administrator if you have questions about completing this worksheet.
3. Complete this **2-sided worksheet**, then sign and date it.
4. Mail the completed worksheet, tax forms, and any other documentation to your financial aid administrator.
5. Your financial aid administrator will compare information on these documents and make corrections if necessary.

B. Family Information

Independent Students: List the people in your household.
