Colleges and universities are asked by many, including federal and state government and national surveys, to describe the racial and ethnic backgrounds of our students and employees. The current ethnic and racial data on file has been pre-populated into the questions. Please update this data if it is incorrect or you wish to change your identity. Please note that the categories of Asian and Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander are now broken down into two categories and those individuals should now declare themselves in the proper category. Individuals who are Hispanic or Latino should now complete the question on race even though it does not have a pre-filled identity.

Select one or more of the following categories.

- White
A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
- Black or African American
A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.
- Asian
A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.
- American Indian or Alaska Native
A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America), and who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community attachment.
- Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

By submitting this web form without answering the above questions, you will be considered as having no race or ethnicity declaration.


Cell Phone Information

Because individuals communicate predominantly with cell phones, SMCM now asks students, faculty, and staff to provide their cell phone numbers in the same way that you provide an emergency contact and a home address. This number may be used in similar manner as a land-based phone number.
