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#### It is a BEAUTY!

A significant milestone for St. Mary's College of Maryland occurred on Monday, August 29<sup>th</sup>. The first classes were held in the new Anne Arundel Hall (AAH) to rave reviews from faculty and students.

According to Chip Jackson, vice president for business and finance, Anne Arundel Hall is extraordinary on many levels. It provides much needed space for students and faculty, enhancing their learning and research, and it brings the College and the Museum together, strengthening programmatic relationships in museum studies and other areas of study. Anne Arundel Hall was designed to enrich the sense of place, marvelously unifying the old campus, the historic townlands, and the new campus. It is the product of more than a decade of planning and design and represents the contributions of many individuals.

AAH North is the home of international languages and cultures and the Center for the Study of Democracy. Anthropology and museum studies are located in AAH West and the archaeological staff of Historic St. Mary's City occupies AAH South. The new building offers an energy efficient geothermal heating system and a rain water capture system that recycles water used in the toilets, landscaping and the courtyard fountain.

Jim McGuire, capital project manager and Mary Grube, budget analyst/special projects manager were two very happy staff members watching all of the action and reflecting on the effort put forth to design, construct, redesign, furnish and open SMCM's newest building. Jim glowed with pride as he stated "Anne Arundel Hall will be a welcoming presence on Rt.5 with the courtyard fountain, brick pathways and lights shining from the Blackistone Room. People will know they have reached a very special and beautiful place."

According to Jim, while this was a challenging project that included multiple design changes to new academic technologies, the most impressive aspect is that AAH was the first capital project on campus to be completely managed by SMCM staff. In the past, the Maryland Department of General Services performed oversight for the College's building projects. Dan Branigan, recently retired associate vice president for planning and facilities, was the first staff member supporting the project during the design stage. Then, as construction got underway, Jim became involved. Mary provided the coordination for furnishings, finishing details, and assisting HSMC with their portion of the building.

The Governor's Cup Yacht Race was held Friday, August 5 - Saturday, August 6, 2016. On Wednesday, August 10, Captain Rick Loheed gave us his account of the experience:

The start was spectacular, the Race Committee was taken out to Annapolis area mark R2 on a gorgeous Beneteau 48 that served as the Committee Boat. We were joined by a 36 Ft Edgewater power boat which served as the check in boat. The weather was superb. We anchored a few hundred yards from the mark and squared the line to the wind. The starts went off very well, with a southerly breeze freshening as the afternoon went on. The SMCM boat 'Sundog', our Seacart 30 Trimaran competed in the multihull A class and 'Riptide', the Beneteau 49 competed in the CRCA 'Gold' Cruising class. Between starts we enjoy some great Hors d'oeuvre's supplied by Adam Werblow, a yearly ritual at the start. It is always a beautiful sight to see all the boats heading to St. Mary's spreading out all over the Bay! Simultaneously 22 boats were started on the Potomac Leg at Dahlgren and 4 boats started on the Southern Leg at the mouth of the Rappahannock River.
