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Have you ever assisted someone who was taking out their bad day frustrations on you, and it took all your willpower to hold your tongue?

Don't worry, many of us have struggled with or eventually **will** struggle with a negative interaction. The key words to remember are: Customer Service—a skill we hold in high regard here at SMCM. The problem with irate customers exist in many workplaces and can be difficult to manage. In the higher education community, our customers are mainly students and parents. Our business is to serve them, no matter what the issue may be, and to strive to do this to the best of our ability. Below are some tips on how to manage negative interactions:

- Listen Listen to what they are saying, and also to what they are <u>not</u> saying. Even if you are not the person they should be talking to. Let them relay their full story without interrupting. This way, if you do transfer them to another line, they'll know you heard them and considered everything they had to say. You'll then be confident directing them to the department or individual they need to speak with, if it is not you. What did they <u>not</u> say? You may have had some clues in your conversation as to what they need. Perhaps after their done you can make a professional recommendation.
- **Empathize** Let them know you are not a robot. You are someone they can speak to on a human level. Let them know you understand their frustration and want to help them work through their issue.
- Ask for Goals what is it they are trying to achieve today? Maybe they are frustrated with what you say you <u>cannot</u> do to help them, so tell them what you <u>can</u> do. "Sir/Ma'am I cannot authorize ____as a request, but I can advise you to___." Even if you need to take their information to call them back with the answer, they will appreciate your willingness to help them execute their goal.
- Short & Sweet Do not confuse callers with too much information. After you know what they need, break it down into short steps for them to achieve and relay slowly. Have them repeat the steps back to you so you know they have a full understanding.
- **Encourage** Let them know it is admirable they visited or called with SMCM. Encourage them to keep a strong guardian-to-student relationship during years of attendance. With a good relationship, they can remain "in the know" with their student as well as keep updated on any information and resources made available to them throughout the academic year. This helps avoid unwanted surprises, feeling unprepared, stress and unhappy campers!
- **Hold up!** Hold the phone, or excuse yourself for a minute if this negative interaction becomes untenable. Leave the situation and gain your composure. Whenever necessary, remind yourself that you are not alone. Call in your supervisor who is trained to help mediate the situation.
- **Remember** Remembering the positive interactions is a great way to make any memories of disturbing interactions dissipate quickly. Keep gracious emails or thank-you letters from parents and students you've successful helped, and remember you make a difference in these students' lives as they achieve a public honors education. Re-reading and rehashing the good times will help you recharge your bad interaction any day of the week!
