

Order of Courses

High School

 In high school, this is done for students by counselors.

- Done by students with input from advisors
- Prerequisites provide background information.

Limited

- Flexible
- Advisors advise;
 students decide
- Major/minor checklists

- School counselor enrolls students in classes
- No add/drop

- Students enroll themselves into classes
- Waitlists
- Add/Drop
