FACTS IN BRIEF

St. Mary's College of Maryland is a four-year, state-supported, liberal arts college offering the Bachelor of Arts degree in 19 disciplines.

Bachelor of Arts Degrees are offered in Anthropology/Sociology, Art, Biology, Chemistry, Dramatic Arts, Economics, English, History, Human Development, Independent Student-designed Major, Language and Literature, Mathematics, Music, Natural Science, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, and Public Policy.

Total enrollment for the Fall, 1991, semester was 1569 students, with an FTE of 1518. Eighty-four percent of the student body are full-time students; sixty-nine percent of the full-time students live on campus.

In 1991, 327 baccalaureate degrees were awarded as follows: Anthropology / Sociology - 20, Art - 9, Biology - 32, Chemistry - 2, Dramatic Arts - 8, Economics - 69, History - 26, Human Development - 28, Language and Literature - 30, Mathematics - 7, Music - 7, Natural Science - 1, Philosophy - 4, Political Science - 34, Psychology - 45, and Public Policy - 5.

During the fall of 1991, the College employed 77 regular full-time faculty (non-"Visiting", Assistant through Full Professor), 17 full-time "Visiting" faculty, 2 full-time non-visiting Instructors, and 46 part-time faculty. Approximately 95% (73 out of 77) of all regular full-time faculty hold doctoral or other terminal academic degrees. Since the 1982-83 academic year, St. Mary's College has had 12 Fulbright Scholars among the faculty.

St. Mary's occupies a 275-acre campus on the St. Mary's River. The physical plant includes 31 buildings; ten and one-half of these are student residences. The College's facilities include a 129,818 volume library, a multi-purpose fine arts center, a community center, an Olympic-qualifying swimming pool, an outdoor track and tennis courts, two gymnasiums, a variety of sailboats and other water craft, and a riverfront boathouse and dock.

St. Mary's College is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

The College has an annual operating budget of apx. \$19.3 million. The State of Maryland provides an annual appropriation of approximately \$9.4 million.

The College reported College Endowment Funds of \$1,328,773 for the fiscal year ending in 1991.

HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Authorized by the Legislature of 1839-40 with legislation actually signed by the governor in March of 1840, St. Mary's Female Seminary admitted its first students in May of 1845. This institution, established in belated commemoration of the Maryland Bicentennial at the site of the first colonial capital of Maryland, was created to provide an academy-style education for women. In 1927, this mission was expanded by adding a junior college division, making this Maryland's first public junior college. Men were admitted to the school in 1949 and the name of the institution was changed from St. Mary's Female Seminary to the St. Mary's Seminary Junior College. In 1959 the secondary school program was discontinued and the institution was accredited as St. Mary's Junior College. Finally, in 1964, the legislature authorized the development of a four-year college, changing the name to St. Mary's College of Maryland. Today, St. Mary's College of Maryland provides a high-quality liberal arts program for baccalaureate students. The College is a vital segment of the state system of higher education, offering a distinctive educational program in the public sector.

COLLEGE PROFILE

St. Mary's College of Maryland is a state-supported, four-year, coeducational liberal arts college. The College is governed by an independent Board of Trustees appointed by the Governor. Located in historic St. Mary's City, 70 miles southeast of Washington, D.C., in Tidewater Maryland, the College is part of the rich Maryland heritage.

St. Mary's is committed to being, first and foremost, a fine teaching institution. A relatively small student body of approximately 1500 students allows for a favorable faculty-student ratio. The opportunity for individual attention from teachers, coupled with the excellent national reputation of the College's faculty, has resulted in St. Mary's being able to recruit and retain some of the best students in the state of Maryland. The residential nature of the College fosters an atmosphere of learning that extends well beyond the walls of the classroom. St. Mary's has established a program and reputation among public institutions which is usually associated only with fine private liberal arts colleges.



APPLICATIONS: FRESHMAN and TRANSFER







RACIAL COMPOSITION of FRESHMAN CLASSES




