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## **Significant Events in the History St. Mary's College of Maryland\***

21 MAR	1840	Gov. William Grason signs into law the "Act to Authorize the Drawing of a Lottery to Establish a Female Seminary ... on the Site of the Ancient City of Saint Marys" (Legislative Session of 1839, Chapter 190).
MAY	1846	The first students begin classes at the Seminary.
	1847-1848	The first full academic year is conducted at the Seminary.
JUN	1874	St. Mary's Female Seminary issues its first "Certificate of Graduation" (diploma) to Miss Sallie Brome Morsell.
5	JAN 1924	Fire guts the old Seminary building of 1844-45 (the first Calvert Hall).
23	APR 1926	St. Mary's becomes the first junior college in Maryland upon recommendation of the Board of Trustees.
11	JUN 1929	Edwin Tyler Burch becomes the first male to graduate from St. Mary's Female Seminary.
12	JUN 1930	Katherine M. Bowdle, Dorothy Connor, Irma K. Mumford, and Virginia Dare Sollers become the first graduates of the Junior College Division.
10	JUN 1935	Charles Birch becomes the first male graduate of the Junior College.
	MAY 1937	M. Adele France is named the first president of St. Mary's Female Seminary-Junior College and the school is included as a regular item in the state budget for the first time.
	1937-38	St. Mary's becomes a four-year Junior College (high school grades 11 and 12, college years 1 and 2).
1	JUL 1948	Anna May Russell becomes the new president of St. Mary's Female Seminary Junior College.
1	JUL 1949	"Female" is dropped from the name of the institution.
5	JUN 1960	St. Mary's graduates its last high school class.
	APR 1964	Gov. Tawes signs legislation changing the name of the institution to St. Mary's College of Maryland.
	SEP 1965	The first resident male students arrive on campus.
28	SEP 1966	The State Board of Higher Education approves the elevation of St. Mary's to senior college status, and the school initiates a baccalaureate curriculum beginning in the 1967-68 academic year.
8	JUN 1968	The last Junior College class graduates from St. Mary's.
1	JUL 1969	J. Renwick Jackson appointed president.
29	MAY 1971	St. Mary's College of Maryland awards its first baccalaureate degrees.
6	FEB 1982	Richard D. Weigle appointed interim president.
1	JUL 1983	Edward T. Lewis appointed president.
12	MAY 1992	House Bill 1327 / Senate Bill 359, designating SMCM a "Public Honors College" and reorganizing the working relationship between the State and SMCM, signed by Governor Schaefer.
1	JUL 1996	Jane Margaret O'Brien appointed president.
1	JUL 1997	Administrative affiliation between Historic St. Mary's City and SMCM initiated with signing of Senate Bill 393.
27	SEP 1997	College approved for a Phi Beta Kappa chapter (chapter installation and first initiation on 22 APR 1998)

## **Facts in Brief**

**Mascot:** Seahawk

**Colors:** Royal Blue, Yellow Gold, and White

St. Mary's College of Maryland is a four-year, state-supported, liberal arts college which offers the Bachelor of Arts degree in 22 majors: Anthropology / Sociology, Art and Art History, Biochemistry, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Dramatic Arts, Economics, English, History, Human Studies; International Languages and Cultures, Mathematics, Music, Natural Science, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Psychology, Public Policy Studies, Religious Studies and a Student-designed major. In addition, programs of cross-disciplinary studies are offered in five areas: African and African Diaspora Studies; East Asian Studies; Environmental Studies; the Neurosciences; and Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies.

Total enrollment for Fall 2003 was 1922 (including 34 SMCM students studying abroad or on another U.S. campus), with an FTE of 1990. Ninety-four percent of the students attend full-time, and 82% of these full-time students live on campus.

In 2003, 288 students were awarded a baccalaureate degree with 52 of these students having double majors. Psychology had the greatest number of graduates (49 grads), followed by Economics (41 grads) and Political Science (35 grads).

During the Fall of 2003, the College employed 108 regular full-time faculty (non- "Visiting," Assistant through Full Professor), 15 full-time "Visiting" faculty, 3 full-time non-visiting Instructors, and 69 part-time faculty. Ninety-nine percent (107 of 108) of the regular full-time faculty hold doctoral or other terminal academic degrees. Since 1982, St. Mary's College has had 18 Fulbright Scholars on its faculty.

St. Mary's occupies 47 buildings on a 319-acre campus on the St. Mary's River. The College's facilities include a multi-purpose fine arts center, a student center, a community center, campus residences, an auditorium, an NCAA-qualifying swimming pool, an outdoor track, six tennis courts, two gymnasiums, a variety of sailboats and other water craft, and a riverfront boathouse and dock.

St. Mary's College is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools with additional accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Music. The Carnegie Foundation Classification Code for the College is "Baccalaureate College-Liberal Arts." SMCM was awarded a Phi Beta Kappa chapter in the fall of 1997.

For the fiscal year ending in 2003, the College had a total revenue of \$42.5 million. The State of Maryland provides an annual appropriation of approximately \$13.9 million. A copy of the independent auditor's report concerning the finances of the College is available in the Office of the Comptroller.

For the fiscal year ending in 2003, the total market value of endowment assets was \$27,243,069.









### **Racial Composition of First-year-student Classes**







**BASKETBALL:** The men's basketball team won the inaugural Capital Athletic Conference (CAC) in 1991. The women's basketball team won both the 1997-98 and 1998-99 CAC championships and received a bid to the NCAA Division III Tournament during both seasons.

**LACROSSE:** SMCM has had nationally ranked teams in NCAA Division III Men's Lacrosse: 1979 (rank = 12), 1980 (rank = 8), 1995 (rank = 14), 1996 (rank=19), 1999 (rank = 19), and 2001 (rank=19). SMCM won the Tri-State Conference title in lacrosse both in 1978 and 1979 and won the Capital Athletic Conference in 1992, 1993, and 1994. The SMCM women's lacrosse team won the CAC championship in 1998, 1999, and 2002 and advanced to the NCAA Division III Tournament in 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, and 2003. During the 1999 season, the women's lacrosse team achieved a national ranking of #5 and finished the season nationally ranked #6. In both 2002 and 2003, the women's lacrosse team was ranked 4th nationally.

**SAILING:** The SMCM Varsity Sailing Team finished at the Intercollegiate Sailing Association (ICSA) North American Dinghy Championships (Coed) as follows: 11th (1991), 3rd (1992), 7th (1993), 4th (1994), 5th (1997), 2nd (1999), 1st (2000), 9th (2001), 1st (2002), and 3rd (2003). St. Mary's also finished as follows in the ICSA North American Women's Championships: 8th (1990), 3rd (1991), 3rd (1992), 3rd (1993), 2nd (1994), 1st (1995), 4th (1997) and 4th (1998), 12th (1999), 6th (2000), 3rd (2001), 3rd (2002) and 2nd (2003). Notable finishes achieved in the North American Team Racing Championships were: 5th (1992), 5th (1993), 3rd (1994), 4th (1996), 3rd (1997), 3rd (1998), 1st (1999), 1st (2000), and 2nd (2003). Additional notable finishes achieved were 1st (1993) in the ICSA North American Sloop Championship; 8th (1994) and 9th (2002) in the Men's ICSA North American Singlehanded Championship; and 1st (1994), 1st (1996), 1st (1997), 2nd & 3rd (2000), 2nd & 9th (2001), and 8th (2002) in the Women's ICSA North American Singlehanded Championship. In 2000, St. Mary's won the ICSA's Leonard M. Fowle Trophy (based on the best overall performance which inc

World's college rankings in women's sailing. In coed sailing, St. Mary's finished the 1998 fall season and the 2000 spring season ranked #1 in *Sailing World's* college rankings.

**SOCCER:** The women's soccer team was ranked 5th in the South Atlantic Region at the end of 1990-91 and 6th at the beginning of the 1991-92 season. The men's team was ranked 7th (1999), 8th (2001), and 4th (2003) in the South Region. The men won a record 11 straight matches in 2001. Both men's and women's soccer teams were awarded the 2002 NSCAA Team Academic Award.

**SWIMMING:** The women's swimming team was Chesapeake Collegiate Athletic Conference Champions in 1990, and an Academic All-America Team in 1998, 1999, and 2000. The men's swimming team was an Academic All-America Team in 1999 and 2000.

**VOLLEYBALL:** The women's volleyball team was an Academic All-America Team in 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, and 1999.



### Annual Tuition: In- and Out-of-state Charges





In addition, the College fosters a sense of social responsibility and community among its students through its curriculum and campus life.

The St. Mary's curriculum stresses both intellectual breadth through broad requirements in the arts, humanities, natural sciences, and social sciences, and depth through rigorous discipline-based major programs. The senior project is simultaneously the capstone student learning experience and an important learning assessment tool. By emphasizing creative expression, the interconnected nature of knowledge, and an understanding of cultures with differing values and institutions in all aspects of the educational experience, the College prepares its students for fulfilling lives and successful professional careers in a world of increasingly rapid technological, political, economic and social change.

As a public college that is both accessible and affordable, St. Mary's provides the opportunity for academically talented students from a broad socioeconomic, ethnic, and racial spectrum to acquire a liberal arts education. This diversity creates a rich academic and social environment that enhances the education provided by the College.

Created in 1840 as a living memorial to Maryland's colonial founders and their ideals of tolerance and innovation, St. Mary's College is the oldest public institution of higher education in Maryland. St. Mary's maintains its identity as a residential liberal arts institution, fostering principles of diversity, civic mindedness, and intellectual exploration. The College offers academic and extracurricular programs that build upon the rich historical, cultural, and natural environments that come from its affiliation with Historic St. Mary's City and location on the banks of the St. Mary's River within the Chesapeake tidewater.

An independent board of trustees governs St. Mary's College of Maryland. With a Carnegie classification of Baccalaureate (Liberal Arts) College I, St. Mary's is the only Maryland public institution of higher education and one of only seven nationally having this classification.

## **Institutional Capabilities**

St. Mary's stresses student learning through extensive student-faculty interaction, the use of effective learning pedagogies, and systematic faculty development. The College believes that excellent teaching is enriched by the knowledge and skills developed in research and other professional activities. Such experiences are also important for students, and the senior project provides the opportunity for students to develop intellectually and creatively in ways not possible through traditional classroom instruction. St. Mary's encourages a sense of individual and civic responsibility by emphasizing notions of community and supporting cooperative or collaborative endeavors in both academic and extracurricular life.

**Institutional Size and Enrollment.** St. Mary's distinctive role within public higher education in Maryland is to provide a liberal arts education in a small residential campus environment. The small size fosters the intellectual traditions of the liberal arts college and builds a sense of community. The low student/faculty ratio allows for close interaction between students and faculty, both in and outside of the classroom. Small classes stimulate faculty to use innovative teaching methods, largely based upon experiential, inquiry-based learning. Faculty members serve as mentors to students working on independent research experiences. Outside of the classroom, all full time faculty members serve as academic advisers to students.

St. Mary's has the capacity to accommodate growth to help meet the increasing demand for postsecondary education in Maryland.

**Preparation for Post-baccalaureate Education.** Traditionally, a large share of all liberal arts college graduates seeks a post-baccalaureate education. A majority of St. Mary's College graduates pursue graduate or professional education. We encourage and support this goal for all students. The learning environment is experiential, investigative, and inquiry-based. In addition, students are encouraged to perform a year-long senior project under the direction of a faculty mentor.

**The Access Mission.** As a public institution, St. Mary's College is committed to its role in providing equal access to higher education. As a public institution with affordable tuition, relative to other liberal arts colleges, the College is in a unique position to offer a liberal arts education to first generation and to economically disadvantaged students. The College also seeks to expand the proportion of enrollment accounted for by minority students through increased numbers of minority faculty members, an inclusive curriculum, and additional financial assistance.

**Preparation of K-12 Teachers.** The College is committed to providing "model" preparation for K-12 teachers. All St. Mary's graduates who are certified to teach must obtain a discipline major. In addition, we require that student teachers spend significant time in the K-12 schools themselves as part of their preparation. The educational studies programs and faculty are deeply integrated into the local school systems. Our faculty members are leaders in helping K-12 teachers learn how to incorporate instructional technology into curricula and classrooms in pedagogically meaningful ways. The College is a state-wide leader in modeling the most appropriate education for teachers. We aspire to meet all of the substantive recommendations of the teacher education redesign task force of 1996. Moreover, we will expand the number of

graduates who obtain certification. The College will continue to provide in-service training opportunities for K-12 teachers.

Information Technology. St. Mary's College of Maryland believes that students must understand and use information technology effectively and creatively. The skillful use of information technology is an increasingly important part of every dimension of life. For this reason, the College strives to expand access to information services for the entire SMCM community, build and maintain a technology infrastructure that is state-of-the-art, and develop a staff that is committed to and expert in the use of information technology. In short, the College seeks to integrate information technology into virtually every dimension of the operation of the College, and to incorporate it throughout the curriculum as part of well-defined learning objectives.

Partnerships. St. Mary's College of Maryland values its role in and relationship to the local community and the State of Maryland. With a liberal arts curriculum directed toward building a broad education and a sense of perspective, St. Mary's seeks to prepare its students for leadership and participation in a changing world. Given this value, St. Mary's has developed an array of affiliations and partnerships with agencies that enrich our offerings to students and provide a public service to the citizens of Maryland. These relationships include ties to other academic institutions, community service organizations, scholarly consortia, and federal government agencies.

Within the last year the College has developed collaborative degree programs with Johns Hopkins University and Towson University and recently partnered with Washington College for study abroad offerings. The College library staff is a member of the Maryland Council of Library Directors consortium that provides for the sharing of library resources and services. Faculty members and students at the College work closely with researchers and scholars at the Chesapeake Biological Laboratories in Solomon's Island, Society for Historical Preservation, The MAC Lab, Jefferson Patterson Park in Calvert County, and of course with our state-endorsed affiliation partner, Historic St. Mary's City. Our students benefit from internship opportunities reserved for the College by the Departments of Energy and Transportation, and a co-op program sponsored by local government contractors for our computer science majors. The College also maintains an educational and facility use agreement with the Patuxent Naval Base in Lexington Park.

College Strengths from Location: Historic St. Mary's City and the Chesapeake Tidewater. St. Mary's location at historic St. Mary's City on the banks of the tidal St. Mary's River provides unique opportunities for environmental, historical, cultural and public policy studies. These opportunities are realized through course-related activities, faculty scholarship, student research, and special programs. They are further supported by partnerships and collaborative relationships with local, state, federal and corporate organizations. The College will continue to strengthen programs with direct connections to our location and community.

Community Services. College faculty, staff, and students are key volunteers to both public and private organizations in the community. The athletic, recreational, and meeting facilities of the College serve as unique and valuable resources to the surrounding community and region. The College hosts an extensive series of lectures, concerts, exhibits, sports competitions, and other events to which the public is welcome. In addition, the College acts as a resource to the

surrounding community by providing athletic facilities to local teams, extensive community swim hours in its pool, reception and convention facilities (especially important during summer months), and informal gathering places that enrich the lives of area residents.

Cost Effectiveness. Institutional operations were found to be efficient in recent assessment reports from peers and consultants. The College is distributing its resources effectively to meet its goals and objectives. Excellent average incoming SAT scores and GPAs and the highest four-year graduation rate in the State are measures of the commitment and success of the College in educating and graduating its students.

### **Institutional Objectives and Outcomes**

The best description of the goals for the College is contained in the College's Managing for Results Plan. The major goals of the College, taken from the Plan, are enumerated below.

Goal 1. Strengthen the quality of instructional offerings; in particular, implement the curricular proposals embodied in the Honors College plan approved by the faculty.

Goal 2. Recruit, support, and retain a diverse group of students, faculty and administrative staff who will contribute to and benefit from the enriched academic and cultural environment provided by St. Mary's.

Goal 3. Increase the effectiveness of the learning environment at the College.

Goal 4. Enhance the quality of co-curricular and extracurricular student life.

Goal 5. Increase access for all students by increasing the amount of institutional financial assistance available.

Goal 6. Increase our contribution to economic development in Maryland.

Goal 7. Increase student and alumni participation in and contributions to civic activities in the Maryland community.

Goal 8. Increase our contribution to the Maryland workforce.




